MARCH 23: Watershed Management Group's (WMG) Luis Salgado will talk about "Rainwater Harvesting for Watershed Health". Green Stormwater Infrastructure (GSI) is an approach to managing stormwater as a resource to provide benefits and services to communities; capturing and filtering stormwater, creating wildlife habitat, providing shade, propagating native vegetation, and helping recharge groundwater are a few examples of GSI applications. As WMG's Green Infrastructure Project Manager, Luis uses GSI as a tool to build community across our region, and to teach the principles of water harvesting and promote the implementation of water harvesting systems at a residential and neighborhood scale as an approach to build resilience as we adapt to the effects of climate change.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

National: S.344, the Major Richard Star Act for concurrent relief was reintroduced in the Senate with broad bipartisan support. Currently, there are 53 co-sponsors, including Senator Mark Kelly. Although a co-sponsor last session, Senator Sinema has not yet re-upped. A companion bill H.R. 1282 was re-introduced in the House on March 1 and currently has 220 co-sponsors including, at press, Arizona's Representatives Ruben Gallego, Raul Grijalva, and Debbie Lesko. MOAA urges us to contact our senators and representatives and seek their support for this priority issue. We need to support MOAA's efforts to get it passed. Weigh in at: https://moaa.quorum.us/.

MOAA announced two priority issues for its <u>2023 Advocacy in Action</u> (AiA) campaign in April. MOAA representatives from across the country will be visiting members of the US Senate and House in April to push for action on the following issues:

- 1. <u>Restore Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) to 100%.</u> Our servicemembers give 100% in service to our country and they should not have to carry the additional burden of paying higher housing costs not covered by their allowance. Please help relieve stress on our military and help support recruitment and retention to sustain a strong all-volunteer force.
- 2. <u>Reverse TRICARE Pharmacy Cuts.</u> TRICARE Pharmacy network cuts announced in late 2022 have created barriers to accessing prescription medications, particularly for the elderly, rural families, and those with serious medical conditions such as cancer, epilepsy, and multiple sclerosis.

You can support MOAA's AiA and all the MOAA legislative initiatives by writing to your elected officials and urging them to support MOAA's priorities. You can use the Advocacy links at https://moaa.quorum.us/. Remember that grassroots advocacy is one of the most effective means to influence national and state legislative action!!

<u>Arizona:</u> SB-1206 <u>Military Spouse Tuition</u> is gaining more traction in the state Senate. On 14 Feb 23, the Senate Minority Caucus gave the bill a "DO PASS" recommendation. We need you to continue to push our state representatives in the Senate and House to support this important legislation!

SB-1375 to amend current law to include NOAA and USPHS active members in the <u>active duty pay exemption</u> in ARS 43-1022. The current language in 43-1022 says "Armed Services". SB-1375 would amend this to "Uniformed Services" granting NOAA and USPHS the same exemption for active duty pay. The current language covers active-duty members as well as Guard and Reserves. Again, your support for this issue is needed to get the amendment passed!!

The Tucson and CMC member catchment areas are comprised of Legislative Districts 17,18, 20, and a part of 21.


